Ethnography Salon: What Good Are Values? The Good of Values...The Better of Judgement

Presented by Cliff Hurst, PhD ('12), Ohio Wesleyan University, and Malcolm North, PhD, Fielding Graduate University

Cliff and Malcolm introduce value-theory and its potential to inform who we are, what we do, and why. Good values and better valuing are two parts of the distinctly holistic and human endeavor of meaning-making. They will discuss its ubiquitous impact and multiple applications in research and practice and how these shape human behavior, development, decision-making, organizational culture, and social change efforts. They will share from their research and consulting with value theory frameworks that include the efficacy of coaching & consulting in individual and organizational growth; how value-cognitions predict leadership styles, ethical leadership, moral choices and judgment and how valuing is associated with cognitive biases and heuristics.

Clinical Psychology Certificate Program Update

In mid-March, 48 Fielding psychology students attended and presented at the American College of Forensic Psychology conference in San Diego, California. Of these 48 Fielding students, 40 conference attendees were students or alums of the Clinical Psychology Certificate ("post bac") Program. Post bac program students and alums delivered 36 poster presentations at the conference. Four post bac students and alums won awards for their poster presentations: Joyce Berhold, Jeff Duong, Anh Lauren Ho, and Ryan Lebert. In addition, a post bac alum, Kasey Connors-Beron, delivered a talk at the conference. Post bac program director, Kristine Jacquin, gave two continuing education workshops. Clinical psychology doctoral faculty Drs. April Harris-Britt and Susan Goldberg also delivered continuing education workshops.

Additionally, Clinical psychology certificate program students are preparing to deliver 34 presentations at the Association for Psychological Science conference in May and 52 presentations at the American Psychological Association convention in August.
